### **BASIC REGULATION**

- Council Reg. (EEC) N°1696/71 of 26 July 1971 on the Common Organisation of the Market in hops.
- Soon to be replaced by Council Regulation (EC) No 1952/2005 of 23 November 2005.





# **Basic Principles**

- Marketing of hops following a certification procedure and a forward contract system
- Recognition and promotion of producer groups
- Aid arrangements for Community-grown hops.
- Temporary measures for resting and/or grubbing up.
- Arrangements for trade with third countries





## Products covered by Hops COM

- Hop cones, fresh or dried
   (Tariff Code NC 1210 10)
- Hop powders and pellets
   » (Tariff Code NC 1210 20)
- Hop extracts
  - » (Tariff code **NC 1302 13**)





## System of trade with third countries

Common tariff customs duties :

– cones, powders, pellets : 5,8 %

- extracts
: 3,2 %

 Agreements with certain countries for special tariffs or exemptions, sometimes combined with fixed quantities.





## Registration of contracts

### General rule

Compulsory registration applies to all supply contracts related to hops harvested in the Member State (inc. forward and delivery contracts).





# **Producer groups**

#### Shall:

market all of the produce of their

or

 market part of their member's produce and <u>monitor prices</u> negotiated between producers and traders and grant or refuse approval for the conclusion of contracts.





## Special temporary measures

- Council Regulation (EC) No 1098/98 introducing special temporary measures for hops.
- Member States may decide to apply temporary resting and/or grubbing up as a means of adjusting production





## Aid to producers

Level of aid

480 Euro / ha / year is paid since 1996

+

equivalent aid called "compensation" for the areas under temporary resting and/or permanently grubbing up.





## Aid to producers

- Administrative and on-spot checks to verify compliance with conditions for granting the aid / compensation.
- Avoid double payment for same area: <u>cross checks with "integrated administration</u> <u>and control system</u>".
- Checks of the <u>hop declarations</u>.
- Sanctions





# Communications by Member States to the Commission:

- Names & addresses of competent bodies for
  - registration of each producer's hop cultivated area;
  - control and update of the system.





# Communications by Member States to the Commission

- About producer groups in their territory
- how these producer groups
  - manage the aid and compensation aid paid to them;
  - which special measures were implemented with the withheld part of the aid.





## 2004 Reform

- In general full decoupling, however,
- 25% may remain coupled for payments to either individual producers and/or to producer groups.
- Regulation (EC) No 1782/2003, Article 68a and Annex VII J.
- Regulation (EC) No 1973/2004, Chapter 17, Article 170-171
