Fleet management

Framework Regulation (R. 2371/2002)

- Chapter III adjustment of fishing capacity
- Article 11: adjustment of fishing capacity: decommissioning schemes are required to ensure balance between fleets and stocks. Capacity withdrawn with aid cannot be replaced. Entry of « safety tonnage » possible without penalty.

Framework Regulation (R. 2371/2002)

Article 12: reference levels for fishing fleets (not applicable to countries acceding after 31-12-2002).

Article 13: entry/exit scheme and overall capacity reduction: entries of capacity exactly compensated by exits of the same capacity.

Framework Regulation (R. 2371/2002)

- Article 14: exchange of information: annual report and peer group.
- Article 15: fishing fleet registers: data on fleets collected and gathered in Brussels. Transparent to other Member States.
- Article 16 : no more access to public aid if no compliance with article 11, 13 and 15. Excess of capacity punished by immediate fishing effort reductions.

Article 1: exemption for fishing vessels used exclusively for aquaculture.

CHAPTER II: Reference levels do not apply to Croatia and Turkey

Article 6: exemptions for entries decided before the accession date.


> Article 7 : entry/exit management

A capacity ceiling is established

$$GT_t \le GT_{03} - GT_a + GT_s$$

$$kW_t \le kW_{03} - kW_a$$

Articles 8 and 9: eligibility of vessels for safety tonnage. Member States are responsible for the assessment.

Articles 11, 12 and 13: exchange of information and annual report.

Measurement of tonnage

(R 2930/86 amended by R. 3259/94 and D. 95/84/EC)

All vessels should be measured in GT by accession date. GT Tonnage is calculated:

For vessels of more than 15 m in length: according to the London Convention of 1969

For vessels of <u>15 m in length or less</u>: based on a estimate of the hull's volume using EU defined formulae.

Community fishing fleet register

Fishing Fleet Register (R. 26/2004)

Article 1: the Community Fishing Fleet Register is a basic tool for the application of CFP rules.

> Article 2: all fishing vessels are registered

Fishing Fleet Register (R. 26/2004)

Articles 4 and 5: Member States collect data as established by the regulation.

Articles 6, 7 and 8 : Member States send data to the Commission every 3 months.

Fishing Fleet Register (R. 26/2004)

Article 9 : communications tools between Member States and Commission.

> Article 10 : Unique vessel number (CFR).

Article 11 : open access to the Fleet Register.
