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Overview

- The industry is supplying about 85% of the pharmaceuticals need of the population with local production.
- Pharmaceuticals industry is able to produce all, except a few products requiring highly specialised technology or having unfeasible high production costs.





Overview (CONT'D)

Number Of Pharmaceutical Enterprises

There are approximately 300 entities operating in Turkey.

Among 52 multinational firms, 11 of them have manufacturing facilities in Turkey. The others import and/or make contract manufacturing.

Domestic manufacturing facilities concentrate on generic products.

From these entities, Pharmaceutical Manufacturing Plant of the Social Security Institution (production is stopped) and Army Pharmaceutical Manufacturing Plant of the Ministry of Defense are publicly owned.

Human Resources Profile

Pharmaceuticals industry personnel with university education is 51.3%.

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Overview (CONT'D)

Import

The pharmaceuticals industry is importing some products in finished forms;

- · Pharmaceuticals needing brand new and high technologies,
- Biotechnological preparations,
- · Implanted pharmaceuticals,
- New pharmaceuticals transport systems (e.g. TTS),
- Vaccines,
- Blood factors,
- Pharmaceuticals with controlled secretion system,
- Insulin,
- · Cancer drugs,
- · Several hormones,
- · Radionuclides,
- Some ophtalmic preparations,
- Antidotes.

Pharmaceutical Market

Reimbursement Institutions are the largest buyers (around 80% of pharmaceutical purchases).





Distribution of Pharmaceutical Market (2005)





Institutions Involved

Institution	Relevant Body	Roles and Responsibilities
Ministry of Health	GD of Pharmaceuticals and Pharmacy	Designates rules and standarts relevant with pharmaceuticals, pharmacy and licensing. Approves prices of pharmaceuticals.
Ministry of Finance	Retirement Fund	Reimburses.
Ministry of Labour and Social Security	Social Insurance Institution for Tradesmen and Craftsmen and Other Self Employed (Bag-Kur)	Reimburses.
Ministry of Labour and Social Security	Social Insurance Institution (SSK)	Reimburses.
Social Security Institution		Will take over responsibilities of three reimbursement institutions mentioned above.





Institutions Involved (CONT'D)

Ministry of Industry and Trade	Arranges pharmaceutical sector at industrial area.
Ministry of Internal Affairs	Cooperates on precursors.
Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs	Has common communiques with Ministry of Health. (e.g. The Comminique concerning the colouring substances for human medicinal products).
Ministry of Environment and Forestry	Cooperates on chemicals and waste matters.
Undersecretariat for Foreign Trade	Informs MoH about foreign pharmaceuticals sector's structure and prices.
State Planning Organisation	Prepares development plan and annual programmes.
