Council Decision 2002/348/JHA of 25 April 2002
concerning the security in connection with football
matches with an international dimension
(OJ L 121 of 08/05/2002)

- Establishment of a national football contact points (Article 1)
 - Tasks of national football information points (Article 2)
- Police information exchange between the national football information points (Article 3)
- Procedure of communication between national football information points (Article 4)

Council Decision 2002/956/JHA setting up a European Network for the Protection of Public Figures (OJ L 333 of 10/12/2002)

- Designation of single contact points (Article 1)
- Promotion of the Network by the MS holding Presidency
- Objectives of the Network (Article 4):
 - Information exchange
 - Set up of best practices
 - Mutual secondment of officials

Council Decision 2004/919/EC on tackling vehicle crime with cross-border implications

(OJ L 389 of 30/12/2004)

- Objective:

Improved co-operation between national competent authorities and between national competent authorities and the private sector with the aim of prevention and combat of vehicle crime

- Cooperation between national competent authorities and between national competent authorities and the private sector (Article 4)
- Designation of vehicle crime contact points (Article 5)

Council Common Position
2005/69/JHA of 24 January 2005
on exchanging certain data with Interpol
(OJ L 27 of 29/1/2005)

- Purpose: Prevention and combat of serious and organised crime, including terrorism (Article 1)
- Common action: Provision of passport data to the Interpol data base – consultation of the Interpol data base (Article 3)
- Monitoring and evaluation (Article 4)

Council Decision 2003/170/JHA of 27 February 2003
on the common use of liaison officers posted abroad
by the law enforcement agencies of the Member
States
(OJ L 67 of 12/3/2003)

- Tasks of liaison officers (Article 2)
- Notification of the posting of liaison officers – annual summary drawn up by the General Secretariat and sent to the MS and Europol (Article 3)
- Networks (regular meetings) of liaison officers in third countries Cooperation with liaison officers in third countries (Article 5 and 6) – Joint seminars (Article 6) – Europol (Article 8)

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Décision 2005/681/JAI du Conseil, du 20 septembre 2005, instituant le Collège européen de police (CEPOL) et abrogeant la décision 2000/820/JAI.

- Etablit CEPOL comme réseau des instituts de formations
- Objectif :
contribuer à la formation des hauts responsables des services de police des Etats membres en développant une approche européenne de lutte contre la criminalité, de prévention de la délinquance et de maintien de l'ordre et de la sécurité publics, notamment dans les cas transfrontaliers.
- Thèmes : connaissance des systèmes et structures nationaux de police, d'Europol, de la coopération transfrontalière et des instruments internationaux et européens.

- CEPOL participe à l’élaboration de programmes harmonisés, assure des sessions de formation, diffuse les meilleures pratiques et les échanges.
- **La Décision du Conseil 2004/566 (initiative IRL – personnalité juridique) et la Décision du Conseil 2004/567 initiative UK – siège permanent à Bramshill) ont été adopté par le Conseil le 26 / 07 /'04**
- Le 1/10/'04 proposition de Décision du Conseil (COM (2004) 623final) visant à améliorer le cadre légal du CEPOL, en le dotant d'un financement au titre du budget communautaire, en faisant bénéficier son secrétariat du statut du personnel de l'Union et en introduisant la prise de décision à la majorité au sein du Conseil d'administration.

- Conclusions du Conseil le 24 /02/05 préconisant le financement communautaire et l'application du statut du personnel de l'Union mais invitant à n'examiner les autres aspects soulevés par la Commission que sur la base du prochain rapport sur le fonctionnement du CEPOL, prévu fin 2005.
- La Décision 2005/681/JAI du Conseil du 20 septembre 2005 (entré en vigueur le 1er janvier 2006), abroge la Décision de 2000 et vise à améliorer le fonctionnement de CEPOL selon les conclusions du 24/02/05.
- Le 18/07/05, le Conseil a approuvé le programme de travail '06 et le projet de budget.

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Council Resolutions of 9 June 1997 and of 25 June 2001 on the exchange of DNA analysis results

1997 Resolution invites Member States

- to consider establishing DNA databases, in accordance with the same standards and in a compatible manner.
- build up DNA analysis results using the same DNA markers
- taking DNA material to store DNA analysis results subject to safeguards designed to protect physical integrity of individual

Demands that exchange is limited to the non-coding part of the DNA molecule.

Urges further study of system for information exchange, e.g. network of compatible national DNA databases on hit/no-hit basis.

Council Resolutions of 9 June 1997 and of 25 June 2001 on the exchange of DNA analysis results

The 2001 Resolution

- acknowledges that efficient exchange of DNA analysis results could be improved by the use of the same DNA markers.
- sets out an initial minimum list of DNA markers used in forensic DNA analysis in Member States (Annex 1; ESS – European Standard Set) and use form already in use in Interpol context. Council recommends to use electronic data exchange.
